Veteran (2)

These two lovely boys both deserved a red rosette.

1. Mynott's Honeybet My Way - 7 year old Ruby, rich in colour, nice size, stood four square, loved his well covered cobby body. Pleasing head, broad skull, ears well set, with lots of fringing, lovely round dark eyes, straight front, good angulations' to front and rear. Moved and showed well, happy disposition.

Minor Puppy Dog (5) 1a

1. Vella's Cinderaic Seduction - Lovely 9 month old Blenheim, rich chestnut markings, well broken, nice size, took a little time to settle, but when he did he showed beautifully. Generous masculine head for one so young, correct ear set, leathers well feathered, shallow stop, black overall facial pigment, good dentition, large dark eyes with enough filling under, good reach of neck and lay of shoulder, well angulated stifles, neat hocks and compact cushioned feet. Moved positively holding a level top line and tail carriage. BPD, BPIS - will watch his progress with interest.

Puppy Dog (6) 2a

1. Lovel's Lovetrac Picasso - Very nice 11 month old Blenheim, up to size in this class. In good coat, silky texture, rich in colour and nicely broken, well proportioned masculine head, dark round expressive eyes, good facial pigment, correct mouth, moderate neck, good lay of shoulder and bend of stifle. For me, I thought a little more body weight was needed, I understand bitches at home in season are worrying him (good enough reason). Although a little hesitant at first he moved soundly, holding a level top line and tail carriage. Wish he had had more zest.

Junior Dog (8) 4a

1. Bett's Kaidee Jasper Karrot At Shelpet - I liked this boy a lot, handsome Blenheim of good size and type, lovely head, expressive dark eyes, good pigment, enough cushioning to foreface, crested neck, good lay of shoulder, ribs well sprung, short coupled, correct rear angulations', well let down hocks and compact well feathered feet. His movement was elegant in action and pleasing to watch.

Graduate Dog (3) 2a

1. Connell's Monaric Heavenly Knight – Very nice B/T with excellent furnishings, raven black with rich tan markings in all the right places, nice make and shape, pleasing head, broad flat skull with well set ears, appealing dark eyes, scissor bite, straight front, good spring of rib, steady with his movement, held level top line, both standing and on the move.

Post Graduate Dog (6) 1a

1. Li's Avalcier Gino – Striking Blenheim in full coat with clear cut rich chestnut markings, lovely silky texture and positive fluid movement, as one with his handler. Well filled masculine head, large round dark expressive eyes, good dentition, lovely crested neck, straight front, good depth of chest, correct angulations' to front and rear, hocks well let down, feet compact and cushioned. A very smart boy.

Special Limit, Blenheim or Tricolour Dog (4) 1a

1. Wightman's Charnell Montgomery At Kailyflee – Another handsome Blenheim, lovely size, moderate bone, beautifully coated with rich well broken markings. Well proportioned head, dark expressive eyes, face well filled below, correct bite, straight front and good depth of chest, soundly constructed, with plenty of angulations'. Movement was positive, holding a level top line and tail carriage.

Special Limit, Black and Tan or Ruby (6) 3a

1. Cracknell's Sorata Bertie – Very nice B/T with a lovely long silky straight coat, with rich tan in all the right places. Pleasing head and expression, large dark eyes, face well cushioned, correct mouth, good overall construction, carried himself elegantly as he moved with drive viewed from both ways.

Open Dog (5) 1a

1. Wightman's Royalston Enchanting – Lovely well presented Blenheim, nice breed type, rich chestnut markings on a long silky coat, gentle masculine head, broad skull with ears well set, plenty of feathering, large dark eyes and good nose pigment, nicely cushioned muzzle with scissor bite, good overall construction. He moved soundly holding a level top line and tail carriage. Plenty to like about him.

Only two dogs in this class, but what quality.

1. Sedgbeer's Rusmic Marley – Beautiful B/T exhibiting a wealth of raven black furnishings with rich tan markings in super condition. On the table he was so good to go over, my hands flowed. Full masculine head, ears well set with plenty of feathering to frame his face, large dark round eyes, enough cushioning under, correct dentition, good depth of chest, straight front, lovely neck and shoulders, strong hind quarters, well let down hocks he used well, enabling him to move with drive, feet compact and well cushioned, held a level top line, both standing and on the move. Veteran (7) 1a

A lovely class of quality bitches.

1. Home's Leogem Scheherazade – What a beauty at ten years old, she is ageless, this Blenheim out of coat, but hiding nothing, with rich chestnut markings, well broken, I reminded myself how she looked as a young girl back in 2006 in the Year Book. Super outline, so well put together with her elegant head carriage. Ultra feminine head, correct proportions, ears well set, with ample feathering, large round dark expressive eyes, tapered muzzle. A lovely picture. BVIS

Minor Puppy (7) 6a

Only two in the class, but one again both worthy of a first place.

1. Hall's Tasset Mary – 8 month old pretty little Blenheim, very much a baby, but all the required attributes were there. Lovely texture to her coat, which was well broken and rich in colour. Soft feminine head with just enough cushioning below dark round eyes, tapered muzzle, good pigment and dentition. Well balanced little girl, moved and showed well, as one with her handler. Would like her to have been more animated in the challenge. One to watch. BPB

Puppy (8) 3a

1. Home's Leogem Secret Garden – Very pretty 10 month old Blenheim, who stood out in this class, nice coat with rich chestnut markings, appealing feminine head of correct proportions, round dark eyes, good facial pigment, correct mouth, lovely overall conformation, pleasing in outline, very attentive with her handler, as she moved confidently, holding a level top line and tail carriage. Lovely puppy.

Junior (9) 4a

1. Towse's Star Of India – A lovely Blenheim, with clean, well broken rich chestnut markings on a silky coat, full, but feminine head, a lot of what I wrote about my BIS winner, applies to this young bitch and in the end it was for me, down to expression between the two. She covered the ground, with ease, showing off a pleasing outline.

Novice (12) 6a

1. Towse's Miletree Total Eclipse – Gorgeous Blenheim who caught my eye on entering the ring, what my eyes saw my hands were not disappointed with on the table Lovely soft feminine head, ears set high with plenty of fringing to frame her face, large round dark limpid eyes (spaced well apart) well filled below, excellent facial pigment, scissor bite, straight front, good depth of chest, lovely crested neck (held proud) correct lay of shoulder and bend of stifle, short coupled, well let down hocks, feet compact, cushioned and well feathered, moved elegantly with verve showing of a glamorous long silky coat, with rich chestnut markings. BB and in the challenge was more than happy to award her BIS

Graduate (5) 2a

1. Godwin's Rebhann Nutmeg For Simpatico – Lovely ruby girl with rich red, well groomed furnishings, nice size, moderate bone, her conformation could be seen in her movement, which flowed, as she held an elegant head carriage. Gentle feminine head of correct proportions, with large round expressive eyes, well filled foreface and excellent facial pigment, good dentition. I liked her very much.

Tarabad's Khatibi Lemon Ada – Very pretty tricolour, in good coat and condition, rich tan markings, stylish in her movement, which was positive and with drive, loved her outline, lovely soft feminine head, long well set ears, nice dark eyes, good pigment, shallow stop, tapered muzzle, scissor bite, good overall construction. My notes say (lacks sparkle) I know why now, she was not being handled by her owner, which does make a difference.

Godwin's Sorata Rosemary – Love the whole colours from this kennel and this Sorata bitch was no exception, lovely coat, rich red in colour, nice size, good bone, broad skull and ears well set, large dark round eyes, enough cushioning under, sweetest expression, dense pigment, correct mouth, good angulations' throughout, tail well set. Moved and showed so well, a happy little showgirl.

1. Tarabad's Kaidee Kiss Me Kate – Nice small compact Blenheim with lovely long silky coat, nicely broken, rich in colour. Very feminine head with the desired lozenge, soft feminine expression, well set ears with plenty of feathering, large dark round eyes and good pigment, very well put together, hocks well let down, compact well cushioned feet. A little hesitant at first with her handler, but once on the move, she was a pleasure to watch, held a level top line and tail carriage, lovely outline and head carriage.

Special Open, Bred By Exhibitor (4) 3a

1. North's Jalesto's One Vision – Stood alone in this class, but more than worthy of a red card. Lovely B/T with raven black furnishings, rich tan markings, fluid in her movement while holding a level top line and tail carriage. Gentle feminine head with enough cushioning, flat skull, ears well set with plenty of feathering, large dark eyes, tan above placed just right to give a soft expression. Lovely neck and shoulders, strong well angulated hindquarters, straight well let down hocks. A very nice bitch.
